Enrolment Scheme Information

Home Zone:

All students who live within the home zone (see map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school. Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

In Zone Enrolments:

Each year, application for enrolment in the following year from in zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in the Prospectus and in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the Board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

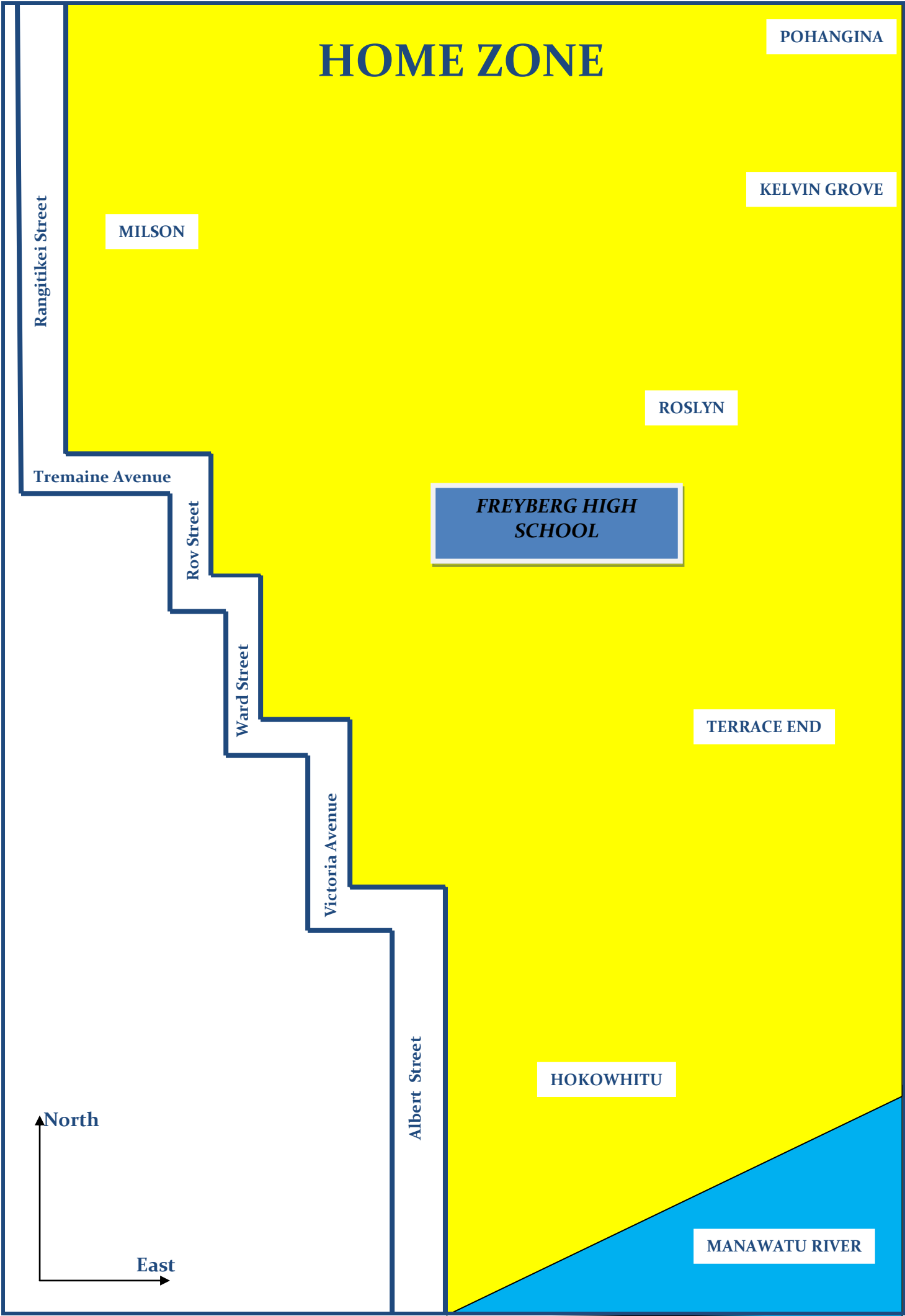

Out of Zone Enrolments:

Each year the Board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment from 'out of zone students' will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority	Students who have been accepted for enrolment in the following special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education. The criteria for acceptance into the programme(s) are as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- <i>Special Needs programmes for intellectually and physically disabled students and for hearing impaired students for whom specialist help is necessary.</i>- <i>Maori Academy (Students must be fluent in Te Reo and will work in an immersion class).</i>- <i>Sports Academy</i>- <i>Music Academy</i>- <i>Dance Academy</i>- <i>Drama Academy</i>
Second Priority	Applicants who are siblings of current students.
Third Priority	Applicants who are siblings of former students.
Fourth Priority	Applicants who are a child of a former student of the school.
Fifth Priority	Applicants who are children of Board employees.
Sixth Priority	All other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the sixth priority group than there are places available, selection will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.
